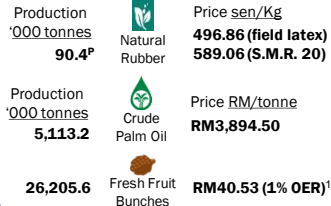

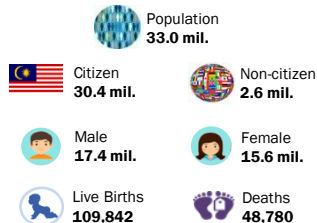

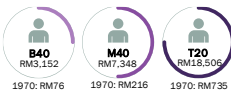

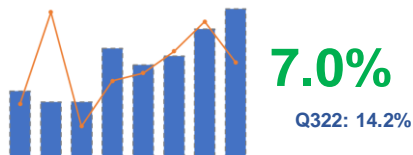

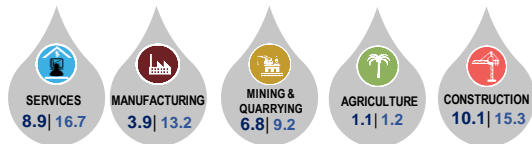

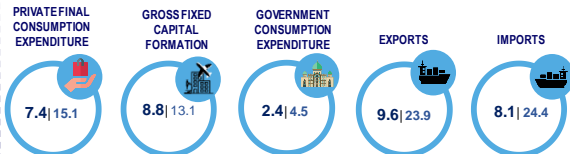

GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT BY INCOME APPROACH FOR SELECTED COUNTRIES, 2021

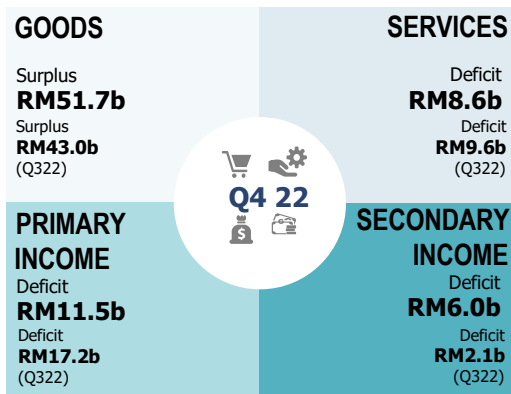

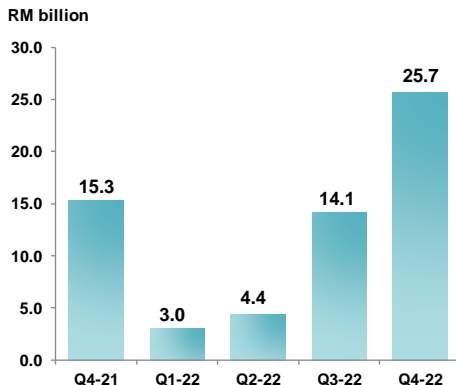

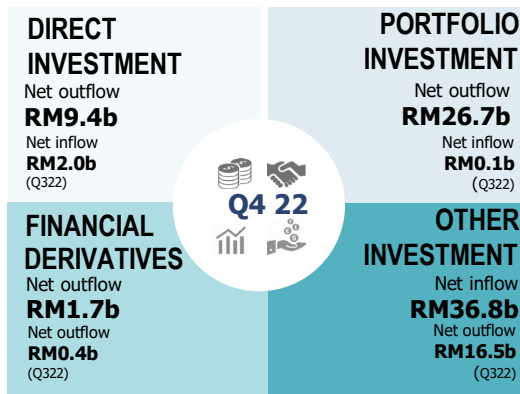

Current Account Balance, Q4 2021 – Q4 2022

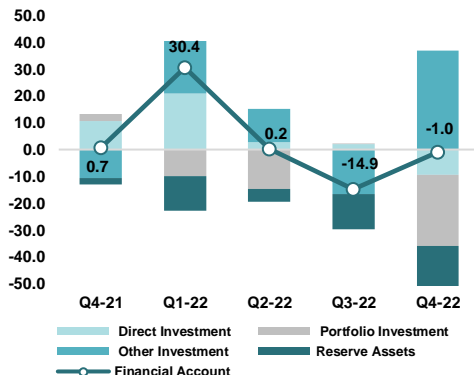

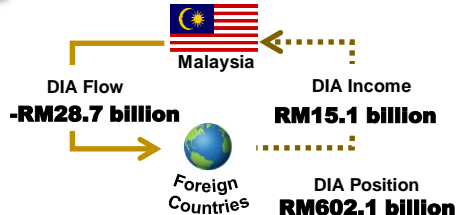
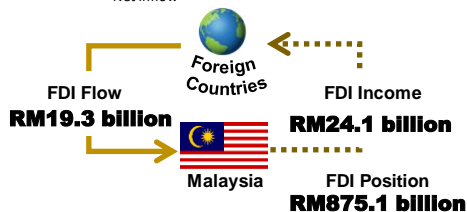

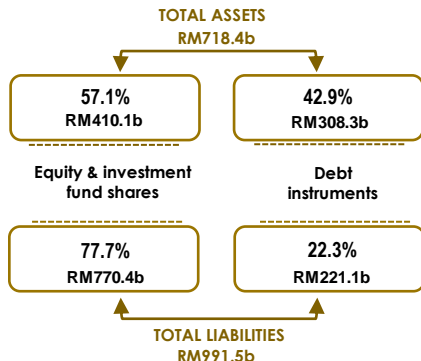

COMPONENTS OF DIRECT INVESTMENT

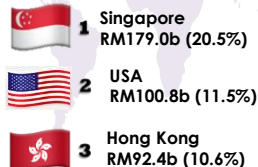


DIRECT INVESTMENT BY TOP COUNTRIES

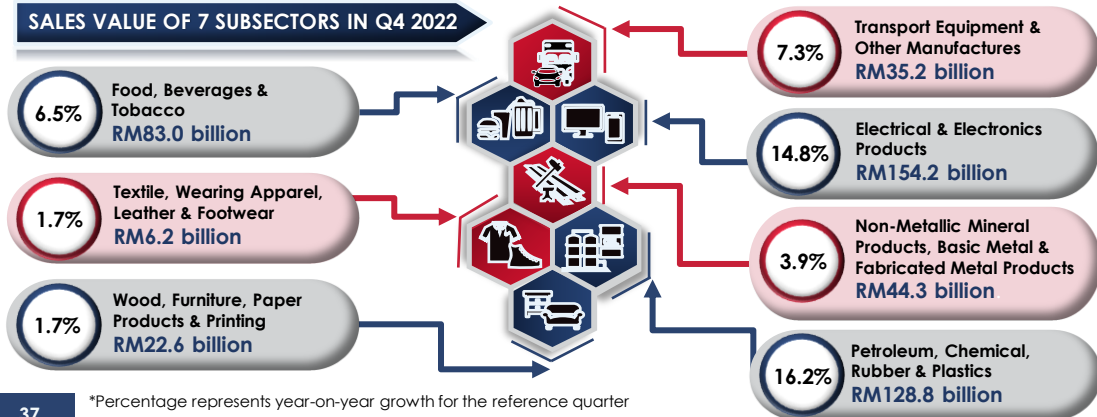

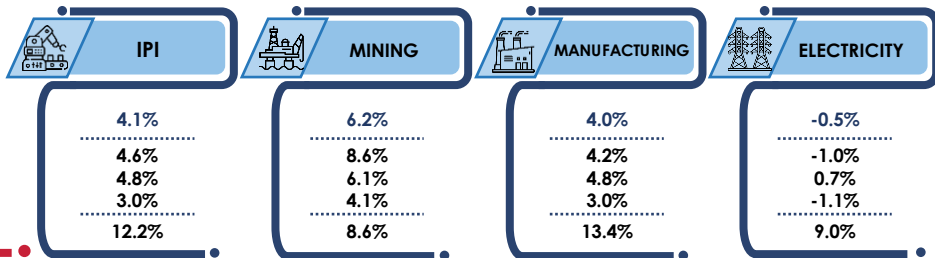


SALES VALUE OF 7 SUBSECTORS IN Q4 2022

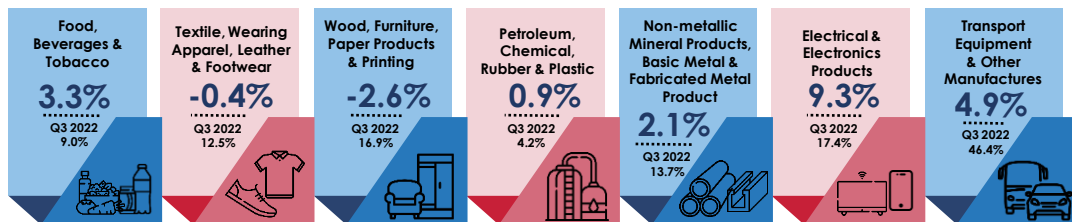

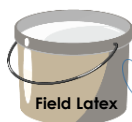

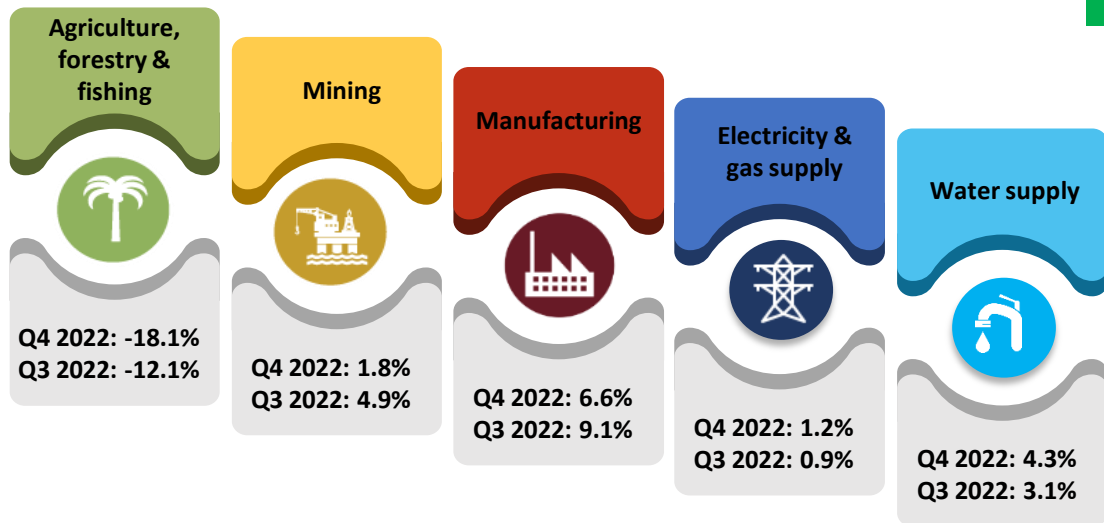

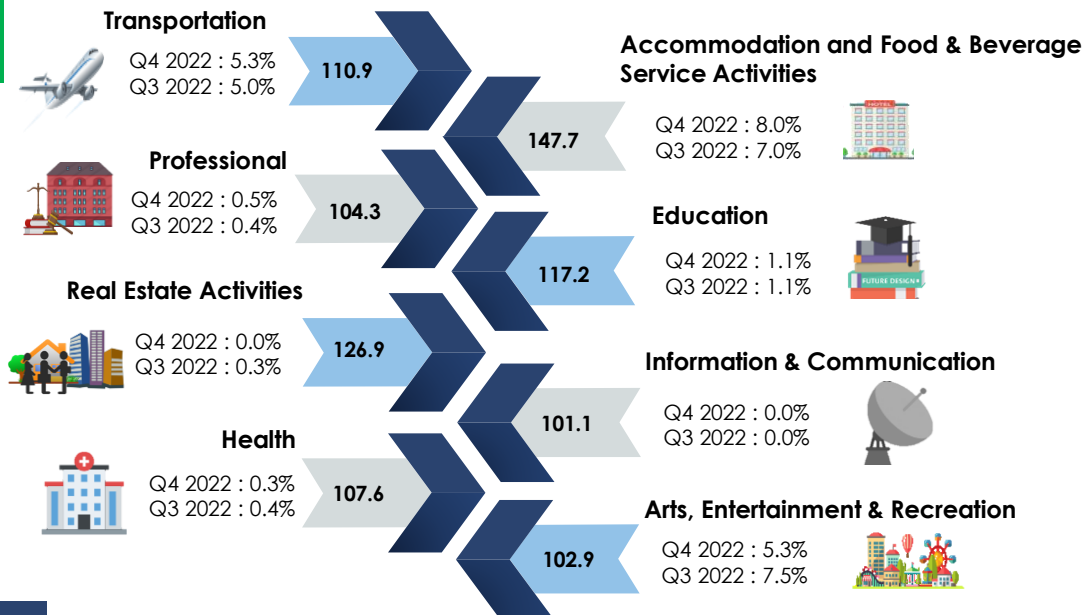
PRODUCER PRICE INDEX

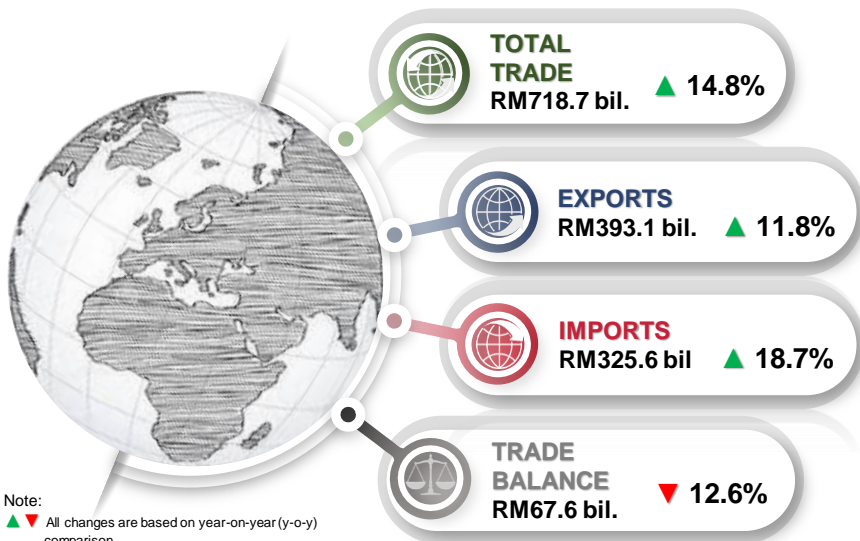

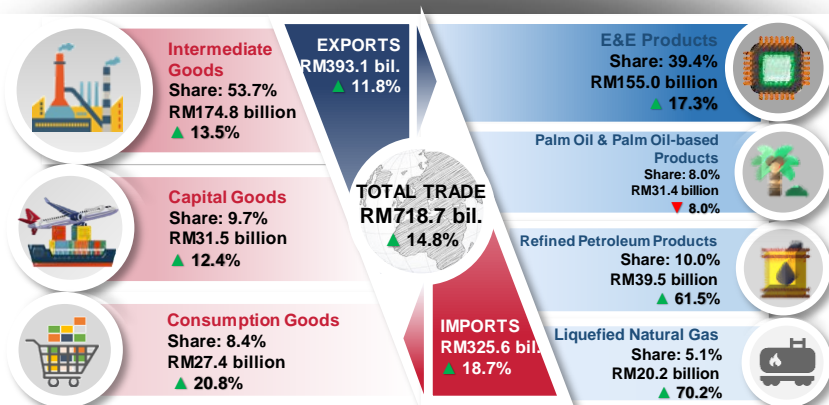

Annual Growth



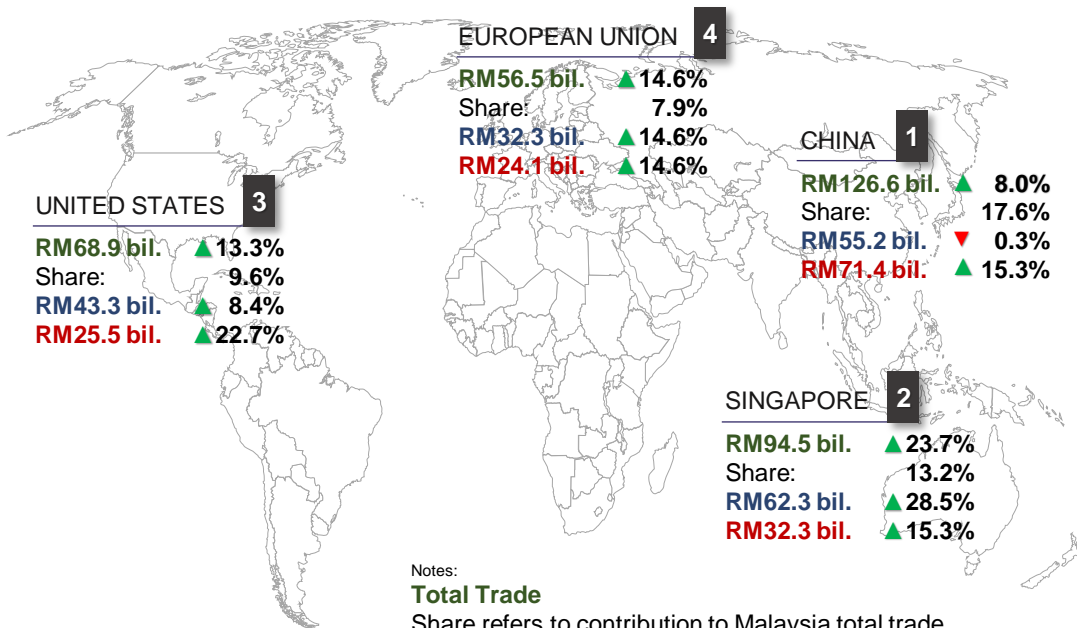

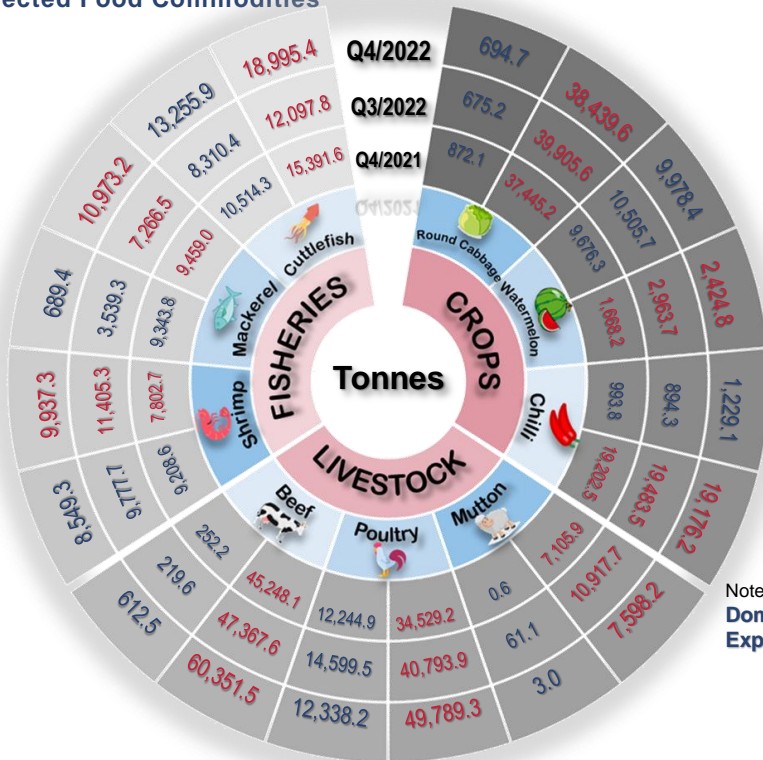

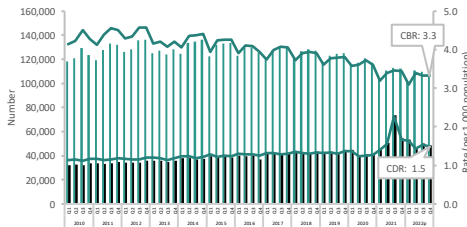

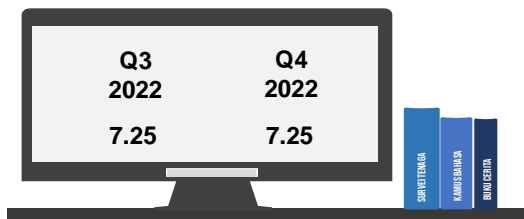

Employed Persons by Skill Level (%)



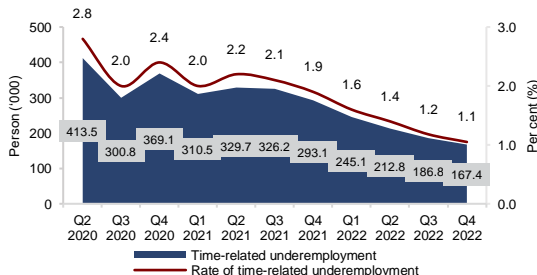

Employed Person Working Less Than 30 Hours



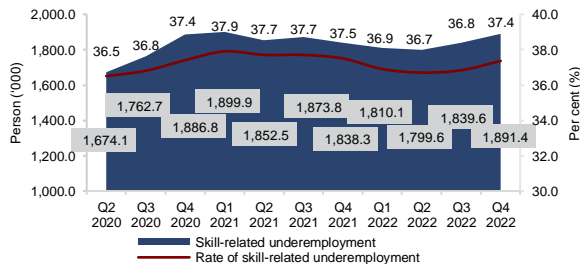

Skill-related Underemployment



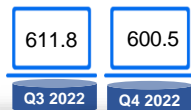

Unemployed Persons



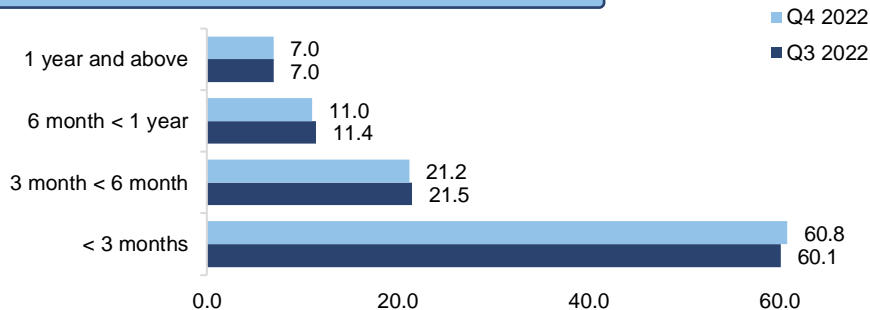

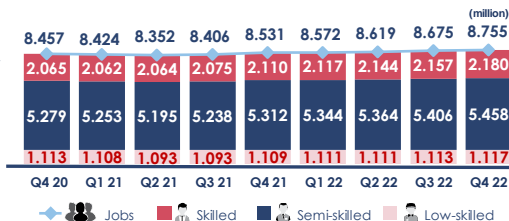

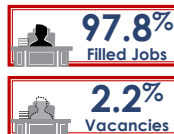

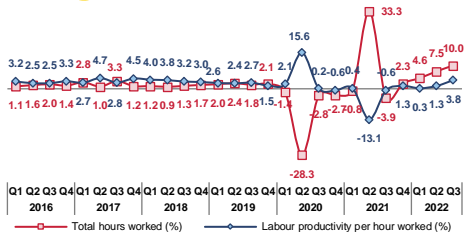

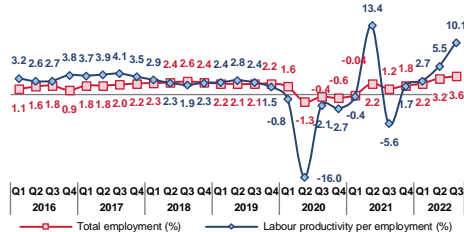

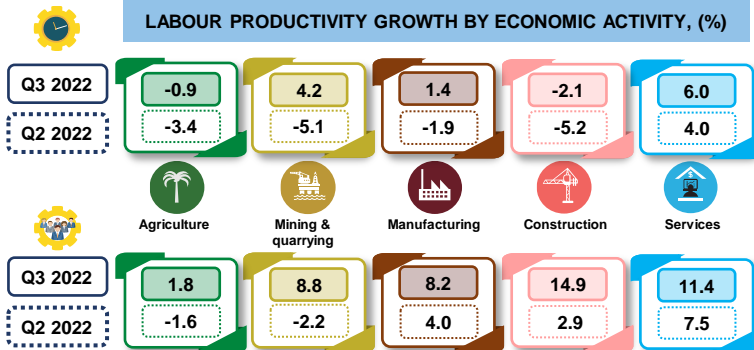
Labour Productivity per Hour Worked



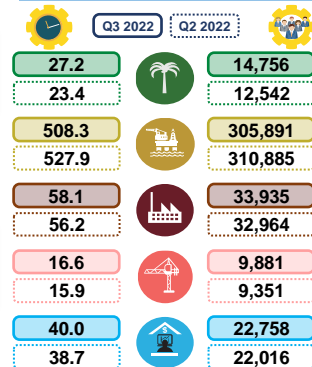
Labour Productivity per Employment

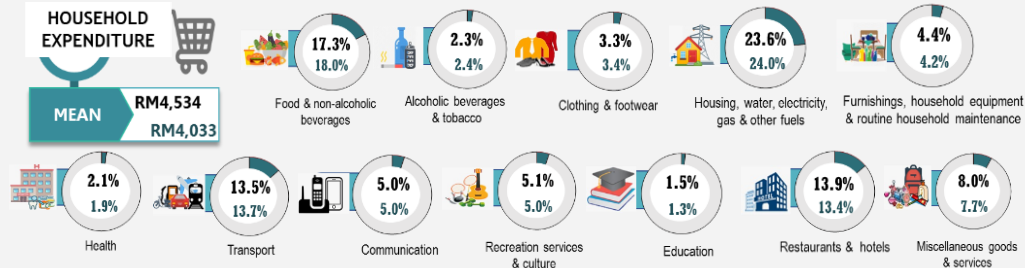

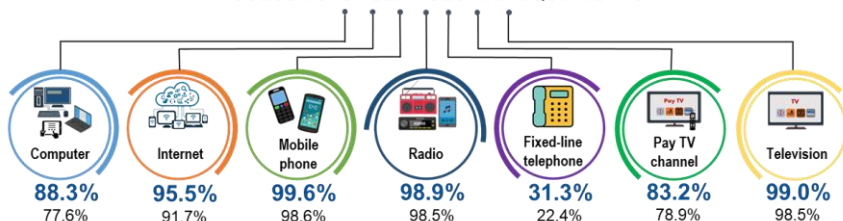

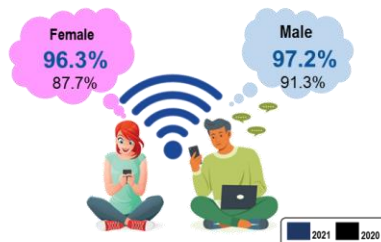


ICT USE BY INDIVIDUALS 2021

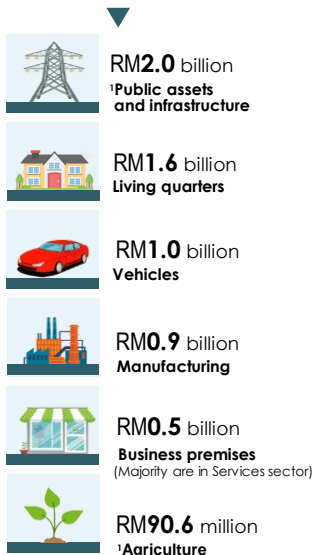
